# Open Call for the Sixth Annual Gathering of the Literary Industry

The next *Annual Gathering of the Literary Industry*, organized by the literature house Lettrétage, is taking place from **May 6 to 8, 2022**!

As in previous years, we want to make sure that the schedule of events is not only made up of our own ideas for programming and concepts but instead also remains open for the proposals of others as long as they correspond to the topic above in the broadest sense possible and are intended for freelance writers, translators, editors and producers of literary events.

The title of this year's event, *Team Spirit. Networks, Collectives, Groups,* refers to something that, especially in uncertain times like these, can make a big contribution to a solid professional foundation: the collegial exchange of knowledge, collaboration and the promotion of shared cultural policy and social policy interests.

In doing so, we always consider our topics as broadly as possible. Proposals that may not seem to completely correspond to the title of the event at first glance are also warmly welcomed - as long as they offer an added value to the freelancers who make up the literary community. Two-hour workshops, presentations and panel discussions are all possibilities. The Annual Gathering will take place both as a live event with physical attendance at the literature house Lettrétage as well as, in part, digitally on the internet.

suitability of the speaker (please details their qualifications in the application)

## Sixth Annual Gathering of the Literary Industry Team Spirit. Networks, Collectives, Groups May 6 to 8, 2022, Lettrétage e. V., Veteranenstr. 21, 10119 Berlin

So-called solo self-employment is neither guaranteed to be a sure-fire success nor is it a solo to be danced all by yourself. Without discussions and networking, it comes up against its limits very quickly. And, in doing so, there is often a very thin line between cooperation and competition. What is the best way, then, to keep things in balance and maintain an overview of the situation? During this year's Annual Gathering of the Literary Industry, we would like to explore all of the possibilities that working together within the literary industry have to offer. What forms exist? What situations are **networks**, **collectives** or **groups** suitable for? And when is perhaps the best strategy nevertheless to make your own individual way? As the title *Team Spirit* suggests, we will look at all of these questions from an international perspective. And, of course, there will also be a great deal of practical topics. How to initiate and maintain a dialogue with your own readers is as much an aspect of networking as the question of whether and to what extent working collectively can provide an added value in the field of editing, or how you can systematically organize updates for your professional qualifications via networks.

As always, in addition to work groups and rounds of discussions, we also want to offer once again this year many practical presentations and workshops that are directly applicable to professional literary practice.
